## PLAINTIFFS' SPECIAL REQUEST TO CHARGE NO. \_\_ BURDEN OF PROOF

In this case it is the responsibility of the Plaintiffs to prove every essential part of their claims by a "preponderance of the evidence." This is sometimes called the "burden of proof" or the "burden of persuasion." A "preponderance of the evidence" simply means an amount of evidence that is enough to persuade you that the Plaintiffs' claim is more likely true than not true. <sup>1</sup>
